FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT
PLEASE COME TO MASS EVERY WEEK AND INVITE A FRIEND TO COME WITH YOU!

Today, on this Laetare Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we are hopefully persevering in our Lenten works of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving charity. We are preparing our hearts now to celebrate the great mysteries of our salvation in Holy Week and Easter. We commit ourselves again every year in Lent to get ready for Easter and renew our baptismal promises. As time comes closer to these great feasts, please come and be with Jesus and our parish community for Mass every weekend. Please commit or recommit to making your participation at weekend Mass the keystone and the rock on which you build your relationship with our Lord and with our parish. We constantly encourage this in our religious education programs, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and at every opportunity to speak and pray with each other. Everyone who ministers in our parish joins our priests and deacons trying to make our weekend Masses the heart and soul of everything we are about here at our parish.

We all need each other to be here at Mass every weekend because Jesus expects this of us. Please receive this consistent and insistent message as Good News, as gentle encouragement, an affirming reminder of how utterly important, necessary and wonderful your personal attendance and active participation in the parish liturgy is every weekend.

When you and I are not at Mass, Jesus misses us! As a priest when I am not present people notice that I am not here. But to God your presence or your absence are just as noticeable and special to Him as mine is. Remember that one lost sheep in St Luke's Gospel (Luke 15: 1-7)? That lost sheep is you or me when we deliberately miss Mass. The Lord wants us all here for Mass because He loves every one of us. When I say we are missed, I mean that Jesus misses us because God Our Father wants us here with Jesus at Mass every weekend. Our Third Commandment is God's own commandment to Keep Holy the Lord's Day.

Our personal presence is also important because our parish community is weakened when we aren't at Mass. When someone who usually comes to the same Mass isn't in their usual seat because of illness, vacation or other reason, people notice and often inquire with the priests about the person. They pray for someone who is sick or away. This means we realize that we are a community. We are trying to be a family in the Lord, so every person's presence and participation is very important to Jesus and to us. We want everyone here so that we become a stronger community of disciples, so that we offer better worship and praise to Our Lord at every Mass.

With this in mind, please try to bring a family member or a friend with you to Mass next Sunday, and on Palm Sunday, on Easter Sunday and every Sunday. Pray about it and then ask someone who doesn't come to Church often. Parishioners do this. You do bring friends and neighbors here. Wonderful things happen to some people who have been away from Church. They have been finding our Lord and our Catholic Church again in their lives. This usually begins with coming to weekend Mass, because of your gentle invitations. Don't be afraid. Count on the Holy Spirit. Invite someone to come with you to our weekend Mass. Please pray that our Sunday Mass attendance increases because we are here ourselves and because we are gently inviting our family, neighbors and friends to join us. May our parish community grow stronger in the Lord each week, especially at Mass.

WE ARE THRILLED TO ANNOUNCE THAT ASA HAS BEEN NAMED AN ADVANCED STEM CERTIFIED SCHOOL SCIENCE – TECHNOLOGY – ENGINEERING - MATH

All Saints Academy is the first school in Morris County and one of only three schools in the state of New Jersey to receive this distinction. In earning this recognition, our school demonstrates its commitment to preparing students for their future educational and career paths by providing a learning environment rich in interdisciplinary studies marked by innovation, creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and problem solving skills.

This achievement is the result of six years of research, development and implementation of STEM education in our school’s learning community. Since our first year of operation, our teachers have worked in partnership with parents, students and stakeholders to build a community that supports and propels teaching and learning practices through the lens of faith, social responsibility and STEM citizenship. We are especially proud that this initiative has been very successful within the nurturing framework of Catholic education.

The certification process began with an extensive self-assessment and self-study to discern our mastery in eleven rigorous STEM education indicators. The process involved the on-site evaluation by an expert AdvancEd review team. The visit also included interview sessions with three groups: school parents and stakeholders, students representing grades four through eight, and faculty members. The team members observed learning experiences in twelve classroom settings, preschool through grade eight. Achieving high scores across the indicators certifies that students have been equipped with and trained to be innovative, creative and systematic problem-solvers across disciplines. The team also noted a strong commitment to continuous improvement based on measurable goals and high expectations for both student and teacher performance.

Part of the review included our creation and presentation of a film depicting the life of STEM in our school community. We chose to base our testimonial on the spirit of our All Saints mission and beliefs. I encourage you to view this movie. Estamos preparando nuestros corazones ahora, para celebrar los grandes misterios de nuestra salvación en la Semana Santa y en la Pascua de Resurrección. A medida que nos vamos acercando a estas grandes fiestas, los invito a participar de la Misa con Jesús y nuestra comunidad parroquial cada fin de semana. Por favor, haga su participación en la Misa de fin de semana, la piedra angular y la roca sobre la que construirá su relación con el Señor y con nuestra parroquia. Constantemente fomentamos ésto en nuestros programas de educación religiosa, en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación y en cada oportunidad que tenemos de hablar y orar entre nosotros mismos. Recuerde esa oveja perdida en el Evangelio de San Lucas (Lucas 15: 1-7) Esa oveja perdida somos usted y yo cuando deliberadamente no vamos a la Misa. El Señor quiere que todos estemos aquí, para celebrar la Misa, por lo mucho que nos ama a cada uno. Así que cuando digo que somos extrañados, quiero decir que Jesús nos extraña porque Dios Nuestro Padre nos quiere aquí con El en la Misa

cada fin de semana. Nuestro tercer mandamiento es el mismo mandamiento de Dios, mantener santo el día del Señor.

Nuestra presencia personal es importante también porque la comunidad parroquial se ve disminuída cuando no estamos en la Misa. Si alguien que por lo general viene a la misma Misa, no está en su lugar habitual por causa de enfermedad, vacaciones o cualquier otra razón, algunas personas se dan cuenta, y a menudo le preguntan a los sacerdotes al respecto. Ellos oran por los que están enfermos o fuera. Esto es muy bueno, porque significa que somos una comunidad. Estamos haciendo todo lo posible por ser una familia en el Señor, y la presencia y participación de todas las personas es importante para Jesús y para nosotros. 


