

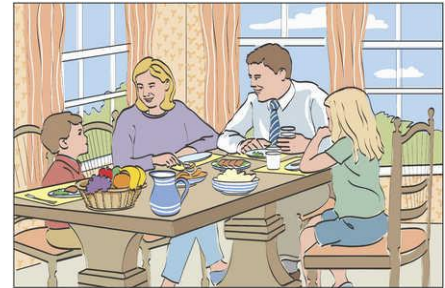

MAKING AN IMPACT ON OUR CHILDREN – THE POWER OF PARENTING

Sometimes, caring parents and other adults shake our heads, wondering how we can help our children stay away from destructive and wrong behavior. One good response, The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University in New York tells us, is right under our noses. They tell us, “Whether you’re cooking a gourmet meal or ordering food from your favorite take-out place, rest assured that what your kids really want at the dinner table is YOU! Family meals are the perfect time to talk with your kids and to listen to what’s on their minds”.

Columbia University’s 10 years of research finds this: “The more often children and teens eat dinner with their families, the less likely they are to smoke, drink or use drugs. Compared to kids who have fewer than three family dinners a week, children and teens who have frequent family dinners are:

- At 70 percent lower risk for substance abuse
- Half as likely to try cigarettes
- Half as likely to be daily cigarette smokers
- Half as likely to try marijuana
- One third less likely to try alcohol
- Half as likely to get drunk monthly
- More likely to get better grades in school
- Less likely to have friends who drink alcohol and use marijuana
- More likely to have parents who take responsibility for teen drug use
- Almost 40 percent likelier to say that future drug use will never happen



Your family eating dinner together – how simple, how basic – but it means spending good TIME together. Can you do this? Can you afford not to do this? Please invest your dinner TIME in your children NOW. You won’t regret it.

Our parish is being blessed this year with a young man, our parishioner, Elmer Nieto, who has been accepted by the Diocese as a seminarian to begin pursuing a call to become a priest for the Diocese of Paterson. Elmer will begin his academic studies and spiritual formation this September at Saint Andrew’s College Seminary a part of Seton Hall University in South Orange. Over the next several years he will be discerning and the diocese will also be evaluating whether God has called him to become a priest for our Diocese. As Elmer’s parish family, we promise to pray for him and with him so that God’s plan will become clearer and clearer during his seminary years.

Elmer came to our community from his home country of Mexico when he was a teenager. He was diligent in learning English while attending Parsippany Hills High School. He has worked hard to earn his own living ever since he came to New Jersey. In recent year, he has been employed in his brother’s family business. For the past 8 years, he has been the Leader of Music at our regular Saturday evening 7:00 PM Spanish language liturgy. Elmer leads a music group which has played at many Catholic Church events and at cultural and family celebrations. We are proud of Elmer Nieto and pray that one day he will be, God willing, a priest of the Diocese of Paterson.

Another young man from Mexico, Eduardo Maceda, who worshiped here in our parish for a while recently returned to Mexico where he has begun studying with the Conventual Franciscan Friars to discern whether God is calling him to be a priest. Please keep Eduardo Maceda in your prayers, too.

Jesus calls us to pray that the Master of the Harvest - His Father and Our Father in Heaven – will send laborers into the harvest. Mensaje del párroco:

Impactando a nuestros niños – El poder de ser padres

Algunas veces, los padres y adultos que se preocupan nos sacuden la cabeza, preguntándonos cómo podemos ayudar a nuestros niños mantenerse lejos de un comportamiento malo y destructivo. El Centro Nacional de Adicción y Abuso de Sustancias de la Universidad de Columbia en Nueva York nos dice que tenemos la buena respuesta justo al frente nuestro. Ellos nos dicen: "Ya sea que usted esté cocinando una cena gourmet, o pidiendo comida de su lugar favorito, puede estar seguro de que lo que realmente quieren sus hijos en la mesa es a USTED! Las cenas familiares son el momento perfecto para hablar con sus hijos y escuchar lo que está en sus mentes".

En los 10 años de investigación, la Universidad de Columbia encuentra lo siguiente: "Cuanto más frecuente los niños y adolescentes cenar con sus familias, menos probabilidades hay de que fumen, beban o usen drogas. En comparación con los niños que tienen menos de tres cenas familiares por semana, los niños y adolescentes que tienen cenas en familia frecuentes son:

- ⇒ 70 por ciento en menos riesgo de utilizar sustancias peligrosas,
- ⇒ la mitad menos probable de que traten los cigarillos,
- ⇒ la mitad menos probable de que sean fumadores diarios,
- ⇒ la mitad menos probable de que utilicen marijuana,
- ⇒ un tercio menos probable de que traten el alcohol,
- ⇒ la mitad menos probable de que se emborrachen mensualmente,
- ⇒ más probable de que saquen buenas calificaciones en la escuela,
- ⇒ menos probable de que tengan amigos que consuman alcohol y marijuana,
- ⇒ más probable de que tengan padres que asumen su responsabilidad cuando algún adolescente utilice las drogas,
- ⇒ casi 40 por ciento más probable de que diga que nunca utilizará drogas en un futuro.

On Thursday morning March 3rd, what started as a normal school day for 13 year old Noah suddenly turned tragic. During gym class, Noah excused himself to the locker room. While in there, his heart went into an arrhythmia which ultimately led to cardiac arrest. A friend found him unresponsive and contacted his teacher who immediately began CPR. The school nurse and EMTs were summoned to help and administer an AED to get his heart started again. He was rushed to nearby Morristown Medical Center. That night he was transferred to Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital at Columbia Presbyterian in NYC and was in the cardiac intensive care (ICU) for almost three weeks. The doctors conducted a successful ablation procedure on Noah and shortly thereafter he left the ICU. However his fight is not over. Even after 5 months in the hospital, Noah is expected to have a long road of rehabilitation ahead. We are hopeful that Noah will recover from the trauma so we can hear his voice and see that infectious smile!
