

MORE ABOUT THE POWER OF PARENTING - EAT DINNER TOGETHER ON FAMILY DAY SEPTEMBER 26

The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University launched *Family Day – A Day to Eat Dinner with your Children* in 2011. After more than a decade’s research, they consistently found that the more often kids eat dinner with their families, the less likely they are to smoke, drink or use drugs. *Family Day* is a national movement that encourages parents to frequently eat dinner with their kids and be involved in their children’s lives. *Family Day* is celebrated nationwide on Monday, September 26, 2016. Become a Family Day STAR: S – Spend time with my kids

T – Talk to them about their friends, interests and the dangers of drugs and alcohol

A – Answer their questions and listen to what they say, and

R – Recognize that I have the power to help keep my kids substance free!

The National Center gives us “Seven Family Dining Do’s”:

1. Start the pattern of family dinners when children are young.
2. Use Sunday as the day to pick several nights during the upcoming week when the entire family can eat together. Make your best attempt to stick to the schedule.
3. Encourage your children to create menu ideas and participate in meal preparation.
4. Turn off the TV and let your answering machine take your incoming calls. Turn off Smart Phones, etc. - just for Dinner!
5. Talk about what happened in everyone’s day: school, work, extra-curricular activities, or current events.
6. Establish a routine to start and end each meal. Offer Grace Before Meals. Light candles or tell a story at the start of the meal; eat dessert or play a board game after dinner to continue the conversation.
7. Keep the conversation positive and make sure everyone gets a chance to speak.

This all says to me, “The family that eats together usually does better – together”. This is Great, Good News! Now, can you do this? Will you do this for your family?

PARTNERS IN FAITH PARISH PROJECTS #4 - NEW INTERIOR CHURCH LIGHTING

In the Diocese's 2013 *Partners In Faith* capital fundraising campaign, we committed our parish's 25% share of the money being contributed to 5 specific parish projects. This week, beginning on Monday, we will take care of our parish's 4th *Partners In Faith* project: New Interior Church Lighting.

Fortunately, we are going to be able to keep the present lighting fixtures and just replace the light bulbs inside the fixtures with modern LED lighting technology that will achieve several good results: 1. More light will be shining from each fixture. 2. LED light bulbs use less electricity. (e.g. 160 watt bulbs are replacing 400 watt bulbs.) 3. LED lights should last much longer than the light bulbs we have now. That means we won't have to rent nearly as often an expensive heavy duty lift that we need now to change light bulbs because the light fixtures are so high up in the church. We have been renting the lift at least twice a year. 4. Since the LED bulbs use much less electricity, we will save some money every month on our electric bill. That's always a good idea!

This is an opportunity to again thank every family in the parish who have made a multiyear pledge or a one-time donation to *Partners In Faith*.

If you are continuing to pay your pledge, we are very grateful. Please recall that 25% of your ongoing pledge payments are returned to our parish once a year by the Diocese. So your pledge gifts are still helping our own parish projects.

As a *Partners In Faith* update report, our parish has completed 2 of our 5 parish projects. 1. Most important of all, we have completely refinished and re-beautified the outside church walls to stop leaks and mold growth. 2. The old parish truck has been replaced with a new truck.

We have done some work on the rectory renovations project by improving the parish office rooms and redoing the small first floor rest room.

We have not worked yet on our very necessary church parking lot repaving project. With our Finance Committee and our Building and Grounds Committee leading us, our parish will continue working to complete our remaining projects in a financially sound way.

We hope to complete the church lighting installation project this week. Thank you all for making all this possible for our parish.

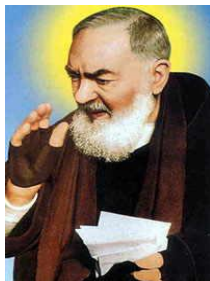

On Thursday morning March 3rd, what started as a normal school day for 13 year old Noah suddenly turned tragic. During gym class, Noah excused himself to the locker room. While in there, his heart went into an arrhythmia which ultimately led to cardiac arrest. A friend found him unresponsive and contacted his teacher who immediately began CPR. The school nurse and EMTs were summoned to help and administer an AED to get his heart started again. He was rushed to nearby Morristown Medical Center. That night he was transferred to Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital at Columbia Presbyterian in NYC and was in the cardiac intensive care (ICU) for almost three weeks. The doctors conducted a successful ablation procedure on Noah and shortly thereafter he left the ICU. However his fight is not over. Even after 5 months in the hospital, Noah is expected to have a long road of rehabilitation ahead. We are hopeful that Noah will recover from the trauma so we can hear his voice and see that infectious smile!

Please join us as a community to help Noah and his family!

All proceeds will go to help the Lorencovitz family as they continue to tackle this difficult situation. They are part of our community and members of Saint Peter the Apostle Church. Noah and his father Tim have been part of the CYO basketball program since Noah was in the 5th grade.
