And when they return home they must receive the best medical care for the rest of their lives. We owe them every penny of that in respect for their heroic service. To do less would make our Veteran's Day celebrations hollow. To do all we can, demonstrates our gratitude and our real solidarity with our Veterans as well as our men and women on active duty at this dangerous time. Pray for our soldiers in Afghanistan and Iraq every day! Please pray that they will come home soon. WE ARE RESTORING OUR BEAUTIFUL CHURCH DOORS

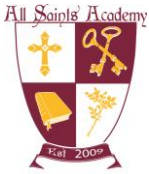
Our parish church is blessed with magnificent wooden church entrance doors. The interior wood doors going directly into church, are still good condition after almost 30 years. Compared with the exterior church doors, they get comparatively little wear and tear.

But our exterior church doors have been buffeted every day, every year by all kinds of weather ever since February 20 1988 when Bishop Rodimer knocked on the door of our new church and Msgr. Kevin Flanagan, our pastor, opened the doors so that the Bishop would enter through the doorway and dedicate our church. (I was at the church dedication that day because Msgr. Flanagan had invited me to attend. Little did I know that I would become the pastor here 6 years later in 1994.) After all this time, the exterior doors are pretty beat up. We have come to realize that these doors either have to be restored to their original beauty or replaced with new doors if a good restoration is not realistic. Our own Deacon Bob Lang, a fine carpenter in his own right and a very knowledgeable person about different kinds of wood, has helped the parish Building and Grounds Committee reach the decision that it is appropriate and wise to restore these doors. I am so happy that this is the right course of action because these doors are very special to many parishioners and they enhance the beauty of our church entrance very much. Deacon Bob helped us choose a company to do this work properly and also at a reasonable price. Several companies were vetted and Victor Zucchi & Son from Bergen County has been contracted to restore the doors. We have 3 sets of 2 exterior doors; the company is bringing one set of 2 doors at a time to their shop to repair and refinish the doors and return them to the church. We began the process this week; it may take a few months to complete the work. Pray to Saint Joseph, the carpenter, that everything works out well for us.

This project is affordable because our parish has received a generous bequest from the will of Jennie Ombaldo, a long time faithful and active parishioner. Jennie’s late husband, Arthur Ombaldo, had been a stalwart member of our parish choir for many years before he passed away some years ago. We gladly dedicate this special project to the memory of Jennie and Arthur Ombaldo. We express our parish’s gratitude in your name to Jennie for remembering our parish so generously in her will. Since we are in November now, please remember both Jennie and her husband, Art, in your daily prayers for our deceased parishioners during this entire month. We look forward with anticipation to the restoration of these very special doors of our parish church.

AN INSIGHT TO THE SCRIPTURE READINGS: 32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Maccabees – There are 2 books – Maccabees 1 and 2. The name Maccabees is loosely translated “hammer”. Written around 100 B.C. and authored by Judas Maccabee (Maccabeus).

Its purpose is to give a theological interpretation to the history of its day and of God’s intervention in the lives of the Jewish people. Of “theological importance are the author’s teaching on the resurrection of the just on the last day” (reading for this weekend).

Sadducees – the “righteous”, a priestly party, described as a religious rather than political group. They denied the resurrection of the dead (today’s gospel) and the existence of angels and spirits. They accepted only the Torah. The Sadducees are often condemned along with the Pharisees by John the Baptist and Jesus in the gospel. They were hostile to the Apostles and Saint Paul as mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles.

The end is coming!!! **NO** – hopefully not the end of our lives or the world – at least right now!

The “end” of the “liturgical year” is drawing near! This weekend, the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, next weekend, the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time and finally – the last Sunday in Ordinary Time is the Feast of Christ the King. The Scripture readings these weekends speak about “the end” that will come in God’s time to all and everything and most important – the “beginning” of eternal life with our Creator, God. On the weekend of November 26/27, we begin a “new year” a “new liturgical year” with the First Sunday of Advent in preparation of Christmas. This is certainly a message of “good” and hope-filled news to all who believe!

RCIA UPDATE

What is happening this weekend at Sunday's, 10:30am Mass for the men and women who are now ready to move forward in our parish's RCIA process?

The initial inquiry period for our parish's inquirers will now move into the second stage. Our unbaptized inquirers go through the Rite of Acceptance and enter into the Order of Catechumens. Our baptized inquirers go through the Rite of Welcoming and are designated as Candidates. Both groups are doing this at the 10:30 AM Mass.

The first phase of the RCIA journey of initiation has been a time for seekers to hear the mystery of Christ proclaimed. Our inquirers have consciously and freely sought the living God and entered the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. We ask you to please pray for these brothers and sisters as they continue their conversion journey, and pray too for our RCIA team as we help them in moving toward a closer relationship with God.

The Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens is for inquirers who are preparing to receive all their sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist - all to be received at the Easter Vigil next April. They are now ready to publicly declare their intention to continue this journey towards becoming Catholics. At this Rite, they are asked to more fully embrace the Gospel message with the help of God, and they are also signed with the Sign of the Cross to show that they now belong to Christ, the Shepherd of souls. The Rite of Welcoming is for inquirers who are already baptized and are now ready to publicly declare their intention to continue their journey toward full communion with the Catholic Church. At this Rite, they are asked if they are ready to listen to the apostles' instruction, gather with the worshipping community in prayer, and join that community in the love and service of others. They are signed with the Sign of the Cross to show that they belong to Christ.

The catechumens celebrating the Rite of Acceptance are: Jamie Carvajal, Karan Chan and William Long. The candidates celebrating the Rite of Welcoming are: Sean Cust, Joyce Greco, and David Philipps. Beverly Merrill, another candidate, is unable to attend the rite this weekend.

We offer a very special word of thanks to all who helped in any way with this celebration. We will continue keeping you informed about the initiation process and the progress of these good people who are choosing to join the Church. We invite you to take an active role in welcoming our soon-to-be catechumens and candidates, and to be models of faith and Christian charity for them.

Please continue praying for both our catechumens and our candidates as they now move into into a period of deeper formation in the faith through the RCIA process.
