OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Today we celebrate the final Sunday of the Church Liturgical Year, the Feast of Christ the King. The Jubilee Year of Mercy also concludes this week.

The image of Jesus Christ as a King may seem out of step with our modern commitment to equality. We are, perhaps, skeptical of high titles and a king above everyone else. But wariness for the idea of kings misses the point about Jesus Christ our King because He is like no other King. He turns the world's idea of kings upside down. He is our Servant King.

Like King David, the Shepherd King in the Old Testament, He serves all His brothers and sisters. And Jesus calls on us to serve one another and thus to serve Him. He is a king who gives His life for humanity. He challenges us that there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. (John 15:13) We are His friends, His sisters and brothers. He is our Servant King, crowned with thorns, ridiculed, scorned and mocked on His Cross.

In today's Sunday Gospel, the cross is the throne of Jesus our King. He hung on the cross for hours, our king suffering and dying for us; He was subjected to the taunts and violence of His enemies. This king enslaves no one. On His cross, He challenges all our ideas about power, domination, violence and ascendancy. On His cross, He embraces all the suffering and pain in our lives. On His cross, Jesus Christ, the sinless one, the innocent king even embraces the appearances of guilt – the guilt of our sins – as He is put to death, falsely labeled a criminal, charged with being a threat to the people. One of the criminals hanging next to Him said from his own cross of pain: "We indeed have been condemned justly for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:41). This guilty sinner suffering on his cross recognized Jesus as his King and Jesus saved him. "This day you will be with me in paradise" (Luke 23:43). We are all saved from our own sin and guilt by Jesus Christ our Servant, our Savior King who forgives our sins from the cross through His merciful Sacrament of Reconciliation.

We renew our love for Jesus Christ our crucified King today. We realize, gratefully, that His kingship of poverty, service and innocence is the good shepherd kingship that saves this world and every one of us. We celebrate Christ our King every day and especially this weekend.

We celebrate Thanksgiving Day this week on Thursday. Thank Jesus for dying on the Cross for us. Thank Him for all the gifts He showers on us every day. Thank Him by helping people who need us at Thanksgiving. Spend the day with people you love, sharing love with each other. Happy Thanksgiving Day!



AN INSIGHT TO THE SCRIPTURE READINGS: SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

In 1925, Pope Pius XI, in the face of rising nationalism and Fascism, instituted the Feast of Christ the King to reassert Jesus' sovereignty over all forms of political governance.

Gospel: The repentant thief, "The Good Thief" is traditionally known as Dismus. He was crucified at Jesus' right. Before his death, Dismus cries out to Jesus: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Remember me Jesus, and forgive me.

Remember me Jesus, and help me.

Remember me Jesus, and give me strength.

Remember me Jesus, and show me.

Jesus "remembered." Jesus promised...assured Dismus: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

The Crucified and Risen Lord says the same to you and me when we cry out to Him: "Remember me!"

This ends "Ordinary Time" and the Gospel of Saint Luke for the 2015-2016 Church Year.

Mensaje del párroco:

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo el Rey

Hoy celebramos el último domingo del Año Litúrgico de la Iglesia, con la Fiesta de Cristo Rey.

La imagen de Cristo Rey puede parecer fuera de sintonía con nuestro compromiso moderno de igualdad. Somos escépticos a los grandes títulos y a la idea de que cualquiera pueda estar por encima de otra persona. Pero, el disgusto por el concepto de monarquía pierde todo sentido con Jesucristo, nuestro Rey, porque El es como ningún otro rey. El gira la imagen de rey en el mundo al revés. El es un Rey Servidor.

Al igual que el Rey David, el Rey Pastor en el Antiguo Testamento, es un rey que le sirve a todos sus hermanos y hermanas. Y Jesús nos llama a servir a los demás y a servirle. Es un rey que dio su vida por la humanidad. El nos dice que no hay amor más grande que el que da su vida por sus amigos. (Juan 15, 13) Nosotros somos sus amigos, sus hermanas y hermanos. El es nuestro Rey Servidor, coronado de espinas, ridiculizado, despreciado y burlado en el trono de Su Cruz.

En el Evangelio de hoy, la cruz es el trono de Jesús nuestro Rey. Colgó en la cruz durante varias horas, nuestro rey sufriendo y muriendo por nosotros; fue sometido a las burlas y la violencia de sus enemigos. Este rey no esclaviza a nadie. En Su cruz, Él desafía todas nuestras ideas sobre el poder, la dominación, la violencia y el ascenso. En Su cruz, El abraza todo sufrimiento y dolor en nuestras vidas. En Su cruz, Jesucristo, el libre de pecado, el rey inocente incluso acepta las apariencias de la culpa - la culpa de nuestros pecados - al ser puesto a muerte, falsamente etiquetado como un criminal, acusado de ser una amenaza para las personas. Como uno de los malhechores crucificados junto a El dijo desde la cruz de su propio dolor: “Nosotros realmente hemos sido condenados justamente porque recibimos lo que merecemos por nuestros hechos, pero este hombre no ha hecho nada malo. Jesús, acuérdate de mi cuando llegues a tu reino” (Lucas 23, 41). Este pecador culpable reconoció a Jesús como su rey y se salvó. “Hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso” (Lucas 23, 43).
