THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Throughout the Church, this Fourth Sunday of Easter weekend, is a special celebration of Good Shepherd Sunday. In 1963, Blessed Pope Paul VI designated this Fourth Sunday of Easter as

The World Day of Prayer for Vocations. So our parish joins with the universal church to ask God’s blessing that each of us may be strengthened in a Christian vocation. Every year on this 4th Sunday of Easter, we proclaim a Gospel reading from the 10th chapter of Saint John’s Gospel, where Jesus proclaims, “*I am the Good Shepherd.*” (John 10:11) and where He explains the meaning of being the Good Shepherd.

The church honors all Christian vocations this weekend. Jesus gives His life for us that we all may experience fullness of life. We pray that all of us are open to God’s call and ready to accept the gift of living our own vocation given to us by God.

If you are personally thinking about what your personal Christian vocation may be for the future, please turn to Jesus in prayer about this. If you are thinking about serving the church directly in the priesthood or the consecrated religious life, I encourage you to speak with one of our priests or Sister Sylvia here at the parish or with a priest or religious sister who you know personally.

About vocations in service to the Church, Jesus said to His disciples, “*The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.*” (Matthew 9:37-38) All of us can please pray one Our Father to Jesus every day as a prayers about our own vocation.

The National Coalition for Church Vocations offers us a beautiful prayer for Vocations which we present here for you. Please offer this prayer on this Good Shepherd Sunday. You might even to cut it out of the bulletin and put it in your prayer book to offer each day along with your daily Our Father for your own vocations.

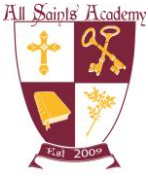

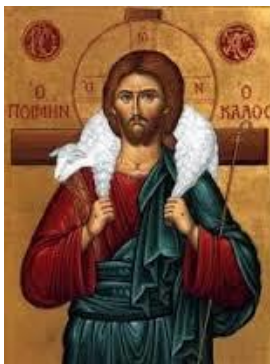

Día mundial de la oración por las vocaciones

Este fin de semana, el cuarto domingo de Pascua, es la celebración especial del Domingo del Buen Pastor. En 1963, el Papa Pablo VI designó el cuarto domingo de Pascua de cada año, como el Día Mundial de la *Oración por las Vocaciones*. Nuestra parroquia se une a la iglesia universal, para pedirle a Dios la bendición de que cada uno seamos reforzados en una vocación cristiana.
