SAFETY ON THE INTERNET AND SOCIAL MEDIA FOR OUR FAMILIES
ESPECIALLY OUR CHILDREN AND OUR SENIORS

The internet is a marvelous tool with great benefits but keep in mind the following safety tips especially for our children and our seniors, too:

Personal Information: Never give out identifying information, home address, phone number, Social Security number or school name in a public message, such as the familiar chat rooms or bulletin boards. Be sure you and your children know and trust the other party before giving ANY PERSONAL DATA. Be extra careful about giving age, marital status or financial situation. Get to know the Internet Service Provider your child uses! If you don't know how to log on, have your child show you. Find out if parents can block out objectionable materials. And please do that. If parents can't do that, that is a big red flag.

Never allow a child to meet face-to-face with a computer user, except with strict parental supervision! If there is a meeting, it must be in a public spot and accompany your child. Remember that people online may not be who they claim to be! Because you cannot see or hear the person it is easy for people to misrepresent themselves. Someone indicating "she" is a "12 year old girl" could be a "40 year old man".

Never respond to messages or bulletin board items that are suggestive, obscene, threatening or make you feel uncomfortable. Encourage your child to tell you if they hear of such. If you or your child receives a harassing or sexual message forward it to your service provider.

If you become aware of transmission, use or viewing of child pornography while online, report it immediately to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children by calling 1-800-843-5678. You should also notify your online service.

Everything you read online may NOT be true. If there is an offer "too good to be true", it usually is. Be careful of an offer or someone coming to your home. Thank you seniors, especially on this one.

Set reasonable guidelines for computer use by your children! Discuss these rules and place them near the computer as a reminder. If a child or teenager spends excessive time texting, especially late at night, there is a potential issue there. Be sure to make this a family activity! Keep the computer in a family room rather than the child's bedroom. Get to know your child's "online friends" just as you get to know their other friends.

I hope these suggestions, developed by experts, may help parents and guardians (and seniors, too). Parents have great responsibilities and challenges. You are in our prayers every day.

MY WEEK IN APPLACHIA

As it was my first time on this trip, I was initially intimidated by such a big undertaking. Am I going to know anyone with me? Are the people down there nice? I could hardly hammer in some nails, let alone build ramps and roofs. But I soon realized how important our work was to their community and to the Catholic Church. Even though we may have had a slanted railing here or there, we carried out the Gospel through our work, as we are all called to do as Christians.

Personally, the most remarkable moment on the trip was when I met Tim, a man who lives next to our work site. By the time we met him, we finished repairing and tiling Sue's granddaughter's room, and we began working on her deck. At first, he talked to the group, asked us how we are doing, and offered to help demolish the deck stairs. By the next day, he gave us a bag of candy, and on the last day we were there, he graciously gave a few of his West Virginia hats as keepsakes. We later found out that he works in the hot glass furnaces in the county, making a small living for him and his wife of thirty years, living in their dainty trailer home.

What is so astonishing is that he, like the rest of the people we met in Preston County, have so little, yet gave so much compassion to our group. We felt their happiness and their kindness, something you don't see too often in our busy, fast-paced lives. Many have preconceived notions about the people of Appalachia, I included, but that soon faded away, as I realized that though they are suffering, they have hearts of gold.

In addition, I was surrounded by a wonderful group of teens. We bonded throughout the week, whether in the dorms, around the campfire, playing intense volleyball, or watching the fireworks - we shared a sense of camaraderie as young Catholics serving God's people. I was grateful to get to know Father Yojan, as he told us to "follow your heart" during the week. Overall, I made good friends with those who came on the trip, and I look forward to seeing them all next year in West Virginia.

Ultimately, Appalachia Help Week gave me an opportunity to reflect on the blessings I have at home, but more importantly on being blessed to be able to share in the love people like Tim and Sue gave us. Those six days are truly unforgettable, and the lessons I've learned will carry with me for the rest of my life. Alexei Sepe

Seguridad en el internet y los medios de comunicación familiar para nuestras familias, especialmente nuestros niños y ancianos

El internet es una herramienta maravillosa, con grandes beneficios, pero tenga en cuenta los siguientes consejos de seguridad, especialmente para nuestros hijos y nuestros ancianos también:

Información personal: Nunca dé su información de identificación, domicilio, número de teléfono, número de seguro social o el nombre de la escuela en un mensaje público, las salas de chat o tablones de anuncios. Asegúrese de que usted y sus hijos conocen y confían en la otra parte antes de dar NINGÚN DATO PERSONAL. Sea extremadamente cuidadoso en dar la edad, estado civil o su situación financiera. ¡Conozca el proveedor de servicios de internet que utiliza su hijo! Si usted no sabe cómo conectarse, haga que su hijo le muestre. Averigüe si los padres pueden bloquear materiales cuestionables y por favor hágalo. Si los padres no pueden hacer eso, entonces es una gran bandera roja.

¡Nunca permita que un niño se encuentre cara a cara con un usuario de la computadora, excepto bajo la supervisión estricta de un adulto! Si hay una reunión, tiene que ser en un lugar público y asegúrese de acompañar a su hijo. ¡Recuerde que la gente en línea pueden no ser quienes dicen ser! Porque no se puede ver ni oír a la persona, es fácil que la gente se esconda detrás de otra apariencia.

Alguien que indica que "ella" es una "niña de 12 años", podría ser un "hombre de 40 años de edad".

Nunca responda a mensajes o anuncios de tablones que son sugestivos, obscenos, amenazantes o que lo hagan sentir incómodo. Anime a su hijo que le diga si oyen de los mismos. Si usted o su hijo reciben un mensaje de acoso sexual, envíeselo a su proveedor de servicios.

Si usted se da cuenta de la transmisión, el uso o la visualización de pornografía infantil mientras está en línea, repórtelo inmediatamente al Centro Nacional para Menores Desaparecidos y Explotados llamando al 1-800-843-5678. También debe notificar a su proveedor de servicio en línea.

Recuerde, todo lo que lee en línea NO siempre es cierto. Si hay una oferta “demasiado bueno para ser verdad”, usualmente lo es. Tenga cuidado de la oferta o de que alguien se acerque a su casa. Gracias ancianos, especialmente en esta.

¡Establezca pautas razonables para el uso de la computadora, Ipad y el uso de teléfonos inteligentes por sus hijos! Discuta estas reglas y póngalas en un sitio visible cerca de la computadora. Si un niño o un adolescente pasa una cantidad excesiva de tiempo en estos dispositivos electrónicos, especialmente a altas horas de la noche, hay un problema potencial. ¡Asegúrese de hacer de esto una actividad familiar! Mantenga la computadora en la habitación familiar, en vez de en la habitación de un niño. Conozca a los amigos “en línea” de su hijo así como conoce a sus otros amigos.

Espero que estas sugerencias, desarrolladas por expertos, puedan ayudar a los padres y tutores (y a los ancianos también). Los padres tienen grandes responsabilidades y retos. Están en nuestras oraciones diarias.
