**HELP OBTAIN SAFE RIDES TO SCHOOL FOR
CATHOLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN**

PROBLEM:

1. Current Catholic school students can only obtain a ride to school for a maximum of \$884 per student.
2. Many bus companies and school districts are unwilling/unable to transport students at the \$884 rate.
3. The ceiling should match cost of living increases, which has not happened since the 2007/2008 school year.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Ask the Governor to increase funding for nonpublic school transportation in his Fiscal Year 2017 Budget. If your family has been affected by this problem, or you know of families who have, tell the Governor the details. 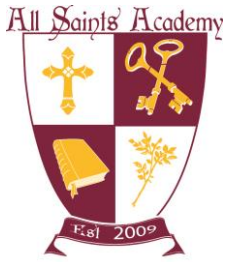
