THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST

Today we celebrate the great feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, we rejoice in the gifts of the Holy Eucharist which Jesus gave us for the first time at the Last Supper. We also celebrate the gift of the Sacrament of Holy Orders at the Holy Thursday Mass where Jesus told his disciples "Do this In Remembrance of Me" thus empowering them to celebrate the Mass and be his priests in bringing the gift of His Body and Blood to the Altar at Mass. This awesome gift which Jesus gives us, the gift of receiving Him in His Body and Blood, His Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist is an extraordinary blessing which can only be explained by realizing that this is the greatest sign of how much He loves us and how close He wants to be to us, becoming our very food and drink, our physical and spiritual nourishment, in the Holy Eucharist.

Rejoicing in this gift again, beyond Holy Thursday, is the reason for this feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, has developed in the liturgical life of the Church. How beautiful to have this great feast to thanking Jesus for the gift of His Living Body and Blood. We rejoice today for the Holy Eucharist which is given to us in every Mass celebrated all across the world.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION REVERENTLY

We Catholics come to Mass preparing to be nourished by the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in Holy Communion. We should examine ourselves on this Feast of Corpus Christi to be sure that we always come to Holy Communion with a spirit of great reverence and gratitude for the wondrous gift we are receiving – the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ Himself. Christ's real presence in the Holy Eucharist is the greatest gift we receive in this life and we must never be indifferent about receiving Jesus in Holy Communion because we do this so often.

We ask ourselves how reverent we are in both our internal attitude and in our bodily postures as we approach Holy Communion. We are walking up in communion with the parish community to be nourished by the Body and Blood of Our Savior who died for our sins. We should be alert and reverent. Folding our hands in prayer will help prepare us to receive Jesus. We bow our head slightly before we receive Jesus. We carefully hold our hands up in front of our chest as a throne for Jesus when we receive Holy Communion in our hands. If we choose not to receive the Precious Blood from the cup, we reverently bow our head slightly as we pass the Eucharistic Minister holding the chalice. Our physical movements should always remind us that a great event is taking place every time Jesus comes into our bodies to nourish our spirit. We thank the Lord for coming to us in the Holy Eucharist, and may we always receive Him with great joy and physical reverence.

Hoy celebramos la gran fiesta del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo. En la tarde del Jueves Santo, durante la Misa de la Cena del Señor, nos regocijamos de los regalos de la Eucaristía, que Jesús nos dio por primera vez en la Última Cena. También celebramos el regalo del Sacramento del Orden Sacerdotal, el sacerdocio ordenado, en la misa del Jueves Santo, donde Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Haced esto en memoria mía", dándoles el poder de celebrar la Misa y ser sus sacerdotes, para llevar el regalo de Su Cuerpo y Sangre al altar durante la Misa. Este tremendo regalo que Jesús nos da, el regalo de sí mismo en su Cuerpo y su Sangre, su Alma y Divinidad en la Sagrada Eucaristía es una extraordinaria bendición. Sólo se puede explicar dándose cuenta de que este es el mayor signo de lo mucho que Él nos ama y lo cerca que Él quiere estar de nosotros, llegando a ser nuestra comida y bebida, nuestro alimento físico y espiritual, en la Sagrada Eucaristía.

Regocijándonos en este regalo nuevamente, más allá del Jueves Santo es la razón para esta fiesta de Corpus Christi, el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo, desarrollada en la vida litúrgica de la Iglesia. Qué apropiado y hermoso es poder tener esta gran fiesta, para agradecer a Jesús por el regalo de su Cuerpo y su Sangre. Nos regocijamos hoy, por la Santa Eucaristía

que se nos regala en cada Misa que se celebra en todo el mundo.

CÓMO RECIBIR LA COMUNION REVERENTEMENTE

Nosotros los católicos asistimos a la Misa queriendo ser alimentados, al recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo en la Sagrada Comunión. Debemos examinarnos nosotros mismos en la fiesta de Corpus Christi para estar seguros de que cuando llegamos a la Sagrada Comunión, siempre hacerlo en un espíritu de gran respeto y gratitud por el maravilloso regalo que estamos recibiendo - el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. La presencia de Cristo en la Sagrada Eucaristía es el regalo más grande que recibimos en esta vida y que nunca debe llegar a ser indiferente con respecto a recibir a Jesús en la Sagrada Comunión, sólo porque podemos hacer esto a menudo.

Nos preguntarnos cuán reverentes somos con nuestra actitud interna, al igual que nuestra postura corporal al acercamos a la Sagrada Comunión. De acercarse a comulgar, estamos caminando en unión con la comunidad parroquial para ser alimentados por el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Nuestro Salvador, que murió por nuestros pecados. Debemos estar atentos y reverentes. Juntar las manos en oración le ayudará a estar preparado para recibir a Jesús. Inclínamos nuestra cabeza un poco antes de recibir a Jesús. Si recibimos la Sagrada Comunión en la mano, sostenga cuidadosamente las manos en frente de su pecho, como un trono para Jesús. Si optamos por no recibir la Preciosa Sangre en el cáliz, debe ligeramente inclinarse de forma reverente al pasar por el Ministro de la Eucaristía que lo sostiene.
