SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO MAY WANT TO BECOME A CATHOLIC?

This week with August arriving – usually, the slowest month of the year – we start looking ahead to September and the full range of action for our home, school, work and parish responsibilities. Here at our parish so many of our ministries and programs will get back into high gear. Among these, none is more important than our parish participation in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. With the leadership of Chris Leone and our R.C.I.A. team, and with the help of our parish staff, we offer the opportunity for people to take a close look at our Catholic faith so that they may decide whether to become a Catholic, or, for baptized Catholics, to prepare themselves to receive any sacraments that they haven't received. This work continues all year.

The R.C.I.A. is an ongoing parish process of faith development for people in several different circumstances:

Unbaptized People: Persons interested in deciding whether to seek full initiation into the Catholic faith. The good people who decide to do this prepare themselves to celebrate all three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist – at the Easter Vigil next March 31st, 2018. We ask everyone in our parish to pray that we will be blessed with men and women who choose to walk this road on their life journey to God. *Do you know someone who might want to be baptized and become a Catholic?*

Baptized Non-Catholic Christians: Members of non-Catholic Christian communities who decide they want to enter the Catholic Church. They would be preparing themselves to be received into the Catholic Church as members and then to celebrate the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist, Reconciliation and Confirmation next year during the Easter Season. *Can you invite them?*

Baptized Catholics: These are Catholics who did not have the opportunity to receive sacraments that we usually receive as children or teenagers. They would be preparing themselves to receive the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist, Reconciliation and/or Confirmation. Some people may only need to receive their Confirmation. *Can you invite them?*

The people interested in pursuing these opportunities meet together, usually on Monday evenings. Perhaps you are one of these good people yourself. Or maybe you have been praying for a family member or a friend who God may be calling to make this baptismal journey into the Catholic Church or, for Catholics, towards receiving all the sacraments of initiation.

Maybe – but only after praying about it – God would like **you - yes you** - to extend a very gentle invitation to a person in your circle of family, co-workers and friends. Perhaps you could accompany such a person to our R.C.I.A. on Monday evenings, beginning on September 18th, as they consider deciding whether to take this journey to the wonderful celebration of the Sacraments at Easter time. **God, remember, calls upon every member of His people – you and me – to invite people to receive Jesus into their lives and to be baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.** So don't be afraid to do this. You are only doing God's work and God is always with you in this. Be sure of that. Please call the Rectory and give us your own name or the name of your friend or family member who may want to learn more about this. Our R.C.I.A. Team will get back to you. Please pray and act NOW because God may be calling you, yourself, or He may be inspiring you to help bring someone else closer to Him RIGHT NOW.

WE'RE INSTALLING A NEW NARTHEX FLOOR

THANKS TO ALL OF YOU

Beginning this week, bright and early on Monday morning, July 31, we will be replacing the tile floor in the narthex (the entrance lobby) of our Church. Demolition of the original, damaged tile floor will take place first. This is heavy duty work. A new and different slip resistant tile floor will then be immediately installed. The project is scheduled for completion by next Friday, August 4. Recognizing that unforeseen difficulties sometimes come up in work like this, we are prepared to carry the project's completion into the week of August 6. But we really do want to finish everything before next weekend as we have planned with the contractor.

Some generous donations for this project as well as the increased weekly collection offerings that so many of you are contributing ever since our "Moving Forward Growing Stronger Together" appeal back in the spring, have made it more affordable for our parish to move forward now with this building improvement.

Both our Finance and our Building & Grounds Committees are also preparing our parish to repave a big portion of our parking lot later this summer. This expensive project has been postponed for quite a while. Your generosity in the Bishop's Partners in Faith campaign and your larger donations in the collection are giving us the confidence to undertake this important repair project for everyone's greater safety and convenience. Thank you so much for making it more feasible to tackle both of these projects this summer.

¿Conoce a alguien que desee ser católico?

Esta semana al llegar el mes de agosto - usualmente, el mes más lento del año – miramos hacia septiembre y la amplia gama de acción en nuestro hogar, el trabajo, la escuela y las responsabilidades parroquiales. Aquí en nuestra parroquia, muchos ministerios y programas retomarán sus itinerarios regulares. Entre ellos, ninguno es más importante en nuestra parroquia que la participación en el Rito de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos (RCIA). Bajo el liderazgo de Chris Leone y la ayuda de nuestro equipo de R.C.I.A. y el personal de la parroquia, ofrecemos la oportunidad para que la gente eche un vistazo de cerca a nuestra fe católica, y puedan decidir si se convierten al catolicismo, o para recibir los sacramentos, si ya son católicos. Este esfuerzo continúa durante todo el año.

Ellos se preparan para ser recibidos en la Iglesia Católica como miembros y para celebrar los sacramentos de la Reconciliación, Santa Eucaristía y la Confirmación el próximo año durante la temporada de Pascua. **¿Pueden invitarlos?**

Católicos bautizados: Estos son los católicos que no tuvieron la oportunidad de recibir los Sacramentos que por lo general se reciben en la niñez o adolescencia. Ellos se preparan para recibir los Sacramentos de la Reconciliación y Primera Comunión y/o Confirmación. Algunos sólo necesitan recibir la Confirmación. **¿Pueden invitarlos?**

Todas las personas interesadas en estas oportunidades se reúnen, por lo general, los lunes por la noche. Tal vez usted es una de estas personas. Quizás usted ha estado orando por un familiar o amigo que Dios puede estar llamando para hacer este viaje hacia la Iglesia Católica o, por católicos, para que reciban todos los sacramentos de iniciación.
