PLEASE CELEBRATE THE ENTIRE EASTER SEASON FOR FIFTY DAYS TO PENTECOST

Most Catholics recognize Lent as a Season – a 6 week season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We say to each other, “What are you doing for Lent?” “How are you doing with your Lenten resolutions?”

Most people, not just Catholics are very conscious of the Christmas Season – or as the secular world calls it - the Holiday Season. We’re all familiar with its very elaborate presence in our lives.

But what about Easter? What about the Easter Season? In our Church this unique, glorious Season from Easter to Pentecost Sunday, this 50 day celebration of Christ’s Resurrection, is the most important and glorious Season of all the Seasons. But this is so very different in our everyday perception because our secular culture doesn’t even recognize the Easter Season *at all*. An outsider to our country might well interpret Easter Sunday just as Lent’s dramatic finale rather than the beginning of the greatest Season of the Church year. Once Easter arrives, spring is here and our culture turns its attention away from Easter to many other things. Practically speaking, in our country, Easter is already gone, over and done with. **But this must not be the case for us believers.**

Christ is Risen, Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! We proclaim this, we celebrate this, and we must do our best to understand this and what it means in our lives for all the seven beautiful weeks of the Easter Season. We need the complete Easter Season. It takes more than a day, or even a week to recognize ourselves and each other as Easter people.

Jesus has lived, suffered, died and rose from the dead all because He loves and saves us as Our Lord and Redeemer. And we, as a church, need to take this whole Easter Season to absorb and be formed as a people by this overwhelming saving reality. Everything Jesus does gives meaning and hope to the world and to our own lives in the face of so much evil and despair that’s in the world and even sometimes in our own lives. Every year the Easter Season is Christ’s answer to hopelessness – as long as we clearly recognize it as a genuine “Season” and consciously celebrate it for all the 50 days right up to Pentecost Sunday.

As Christ’s disciples today, He calls on us to be the proclaimers of His Easter Gospel of Life. We stand up for life and for the dignity of every human life, because Jesus loves every human being and gives immeasurable dignity to every human person. Our late Holy Father, Saint John Paul II told us that we – Christ’s disciples – are in a great struggle with a culture of death. We proclaim Christ’s Easter Gospel of Life to a world fascinated by death – abortion, later term partial birth abortions, assisted suicide, capital punishment, racism and terrorism – all forms of killing that are supposed to make the world better for everyone. We are struggling with a frightening war of terror, with people who are committed to destruction and mass killing, genocide! But death only begets more death and life begets life. Pray that we live the Easter Gospel of Life!

Christ and His Church ask us to celebrate life all through this Easter Season so that we will receive the strength, courage and ongoing hope to live and spread His Gospel of Life all year long. Every Sunday of the year echoes Easter Sunday, the great Sunday. Every Sunday Jesus nourishes us here with His Body and Blood in Holy Communion. Every Sunday He nourishes us with His word in the sacred Scriptures. Each and every Sunday Jesus expects us to be with Him here at Church.

Here and now we are worshipping Jesus during the 7 great weeks of Easter as we sing “Alleluia” to His triumph over death. Please live this Easter Season every day. Please celebrate this entire Easter Season. Please embrace Christ as Our Way, Our Truth, and Our Life forever. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

OUR BAPTISMAL FONT

We are brought to the Lord on the day we are Baptized – arguably the most important day of our lives – that initiates us into the death and resurrection of Jesus, the formal, sacramental beginning of our lives as Christ’s disciples.

Our Baptistry was a lovely wooden structure. Several years ago we added the striking Baptism pool and moved the Baptistry to its location at the middle center of the Church in the midst of the pews where the faithful assemble to celebrate the Mass.

Our wooden Baptistry had _____ thirty years of _____ and _____. It was determined that it wasn’t practical to make reasonable repairs. The Baptistry needed to be replaced.

Through the kind generosity of a parish benefactor, we have been able to build a beautiful new Baptistry in the exact same shape as the original. The center aisle has also been tiled to avoid having a lip that people could easily trip over. The new Baptistry and the new tile floor are both very beautiful enhancements to our parish Church where the sacred action of Baptism takes place.

We are so grateful for the generosity that has made these substantial improvements possible without financial pressure on the parish. We hope that you will be pleased with these improvements. Again, we thank our benefactors for farsighted generosity and _____ to making our parish church always more beautiful for our worship and _____ of our loving God.

**PARTNERS IN FAITH – A SUMMARY PROGRESS REPORT
60% OF PARTNERS IN FAITH CONTRIBUTIONS BEING
MADE NOW ARE COMING BACK TO OUR PARISH**

Last year, in 2017, our **Partners in Faith** pledge gifts surpassed our total campaign goal of \$905,000. From 2013 to 2017 our parish received back \$226,500, 25% of our contributions as the parish share of our \$905,000 campaign goal. Late in 2017, our parish contributions began to exceed the \$905,000 goal. **Congratulations!** Thank you very much!

Because our parish has reached its campaign goal, we now receive a 60% share of every gift that our parishioners are still contributing to **Partners in Faith**. After achieving the goal, our parishioners subsequently contributed \$15,691.79 more to **Partners in Faith** in 2017. Our parish share of this money was \$9,415.07 (60%) through December 31, 2017. This is good news!

So now in 2018 and beyond, our parish is receiving back 60% of everything we contribute to **Partners in Faith**. If you are still making payments on your **Partners in Faith** pledge, thank you for your perseverance. We especially urge you now to please continue making your pledge payments because our parish will receive 60% of your contributions back from the diocese.

Our parish decided on 5 **Partners in Faith** projects for our own parish in 2013. Since then our parish share of **Partners in Faith** has enabled us to completely restore the exterior church walls, our most important priority, to buy a new parish truck, to pave a large part of our parking lot, to update our church lighting system and upgrade some parish office space in the rectory. Thank you!

We still have more parish **Partners in Faith** projects to accomplish: finish paving our parking lot and upgrade our outside lights and to make repairs in the rectory. Your continuing pledge gifts now are giving us more resources to keep working at and paying for these necessary repairs and improvements.

Thanks again to everyone who has completed your **Partners in Faith** pledge. You have helped our diocese and our parish. Please be faithful to your pledges if you are still working on them. Por favor celebre los 50 días del tiempo de Pascua hasta el Domingo de Pentecostés

La mayoría de los católicos reconocen que la Cuaresma es un tiempo – 6 semanas de oración, ayuno y limosna. Nos preguntamos unos a otros “¿Qué estás haciendo para la Cuaresma? ¿Cómo vas con tus resoluciones Cuaresmales?” La mayoría de la gente – no sólo los católicos, son muy conscientes de la temporada de Navidad, o los días festivos como el mundo secular los llaman. Y todos estamos muy familiarizados con su presencia muy elaborada en la mayor parte de nuestras vidas.

Pero ¿qué pasa con la Pascua? ¿Qué pasa con el tiempo de Pascua? Ante los ojos de la Iglesia este tiempo desde la Pascua hasta el Domingo de Pentecostés, esta celebración de 50 días de la Resurrección de Cristo, es el tiempo más importante y glorioso de todos los tiempos. Pero nuestra percepción es bien diferente, porque nuestra cultura no reconoce la temporada de Pascua en absoluto. Una persona ajena a nuestra tierra, fácilmente puede interpretar el Domingo de Pascua como el dramático final de la Cuaresma, y no el principio de la temporada más grandiosa del año entero. Una vez que viene la Pascua, la primavera está aquí y culturalmente nuestra atención se dirige a muchas otras cosas. En términos prácticos, la Pascua se ha ido y ya hemos terminado con ella. **Pero para nosotros los creyentes no deber ser ese el caso.**

Jesucristo ha resucitado, ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya! Proclamamos ésto, lo celebramos y debemos hacer nuestro mejor esfuerzo por entenderlo durante todas estas siete preciosas semanas del tiempo de Pascua. Necesitamos toda la temporada de Pascua. Se necesita más de un día, o incluso una semana para vernos unos a otros como gente de la Pascua.

Jesús vivió, murió y resucitó de entre los muertos porque El ama y nos salva como nuestro Señor y Redentor. Y nosotros, como Iglesia tomamos todo este tiempo de Pascua para absorber y formarnos como pueblo por la abrumadora realidad redentora, que da significado y esperanza al mundo y a nuestras vidas, ante tanto mal y sufrimiento en el mundo y muchas veces, también, en nuestras propias vidas. 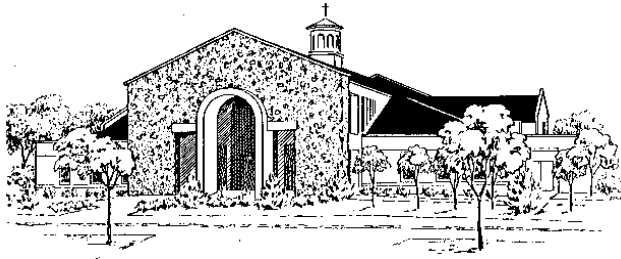

Cada domingo celebramos el triunfo de Cristo en la Vida, la cual El nos llama a abrazar en nuestras propias vidas cotidianas a través de nuestra adoración. Cada domingo Jesús nos llama a estar con El en la Iglesia. Aquí y ahora, estamos adorando a Jesús durante los gran 7 semanas de la Pascua, cuando cantamos “Aleluya” a Su triunfo. Por favor, vivan este tiempo de Pascua. Por favor, celebren este tiempo de Pascua. Por favor, acepten a Cristo como nuestro Camino, nuestra Verdad y nuestra Vida eterna. ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya!
